Progress With Unity Podcast



The 2022/23 season heralds the 10th anniversary of the Progress With Unity Podcast and as always we stand excited about what the new campaign will bring. A new season, renewed optimism, fresh goals and lots for us to chat about on our twice weekly show.

In the last 10 years we have produced 525 episodes with over 1 million downloads.

Last season, coming off the back of administration and with new owners at the helm, was simply outstanding. The players embraced the ethos of the club and the supporters got behind the team with some exceptional away days. Lifting the trophy as League One Champions on the final day of the season crowned a truly memorable season.

The podcast charted each game as it came and went and as a group of die hard Latics fans we were certainly positive on each episode. There are three regular members, Adam, Barry and Paul, but we do have guest appearances, from opposition fans to both current and former Latics players, staff and even the CEO Mal Brannigan has featured twice.

Over the summer we ran a feature, 'Latics Shorts – The Games Of Our Lives', a short story around a particular game and what it means personally, individual fans recorded their story and it made for great listening. These episodes are still available and we would recommend that you check them out.

Recently Sam Swanton, you'll know him as Swanny the club shop manager, featured on the podcast, he appeared to chat about this seasons kits, his insight was excellent, did you know that next seasons kit is already at the design stage?

Sam has a major input into the design of the kit, together with Mal Brannigan, they discuss, argue, debate and finally agree on what it will look like, then a prototype of the kit is sent to Puma HQ in Germany to see if it can be made to the design specifications, if so it's all systems go, if not then some 'tweaking' will be necessary.

Those home and away strips are literally a work of art.

Our aims this coming season are not to take ourselves too seriously, hopefully keep those who listen entertained, to be a voice for Latics fans and help to spread the word of Wigan Athletic far and wide.

New episodes are released Sunday and Wednesday during the season. We will also be doing some live Podcasts in the Supporters' Club Bar in the South-Stand, the first of these being at the Burnley match on the 28th August.

The Supporters Project



As we enter the 2022-23 season, we also begin our second year working with the Wigan Athletic Community Trust on "The Supporters Project". The legacy of the first Crowdfunder fundraise in 2020, hundreds of people in Wigan Borough have already benefitted from investment in the three strands of the project. Ten grass roots football clubs received much needed grants of £1000 each which were then match-funded by Wigan Council. The Extra-Time project which aims to tackle social isolation in vulnerable

and older people in the town, has been funded for 2 years until September 2023. Finally, the most ambitious strand of the project aims to setup a work experience and alternative provision offer for teenagers in secondary schools across Wigan and Leigh. Now successfully piloted, 2022-23 will see the full rollout of the third strand of the Supporters Project. Look out for further news of these projects this season.
